Visitors to Westlake

Thanks to **Abbey Suyker**, Class of 2014, who visited her old school recently, talking to senior Social Studies classes. Abbey took 2015 as a gap year, working as a teacher aide at Willow Park Primary, and also spent a month in Kolkata, India, where she worked alongside women being liberated from the slavery industry.



She was a volunteer with Freeset, a New Zealand initiated Fairtrade business offering employment to women trapped in Kolkata's sex trade. This year she has started a Bachelor in Social Work at the University of Auckland.

Jo Aleh, Olympic Champion 2012, visited Westlake at the end of 2015 to speak to students involved in the CYGNET programme. Jo became the first Westlake student to win an Olympic Gold Medal when along with her partner Polly Powrie she won the 470 sailing class at the 2012 London games and is now preparing for Rio.

Alumna Profile

Sarah's musical passion was clear from an early age and was expressed during her years at Westlake (1997-2001) through the choir (Key Cygnetures), playing oboe in the Orchestra, being a national finalist in the 1999 Rockquest, and composition and academic music awards. She was the top scholar in music in NZ for her year.

Sarah Belkner (née McCallum), now based in Sydney, returned to New Zealand in November for three NZ shows and as a guest performer at the 2015 AIMES Awards, the North Harbour Club's annual recognition of young talent on the North Shore.

She left Westlake to study Classical Composition and Contemporary Music at Auckland University.

Following graduation she continued to compose and perform in New Zealand, appearing twice at 'Christmas in the Park' and being a member of the Tower NZ Youth Choir. Sarah moved to Australia in 2008 where she has been regularly playing and touring with well-known musicians, arranging and producing in studios and composing and arranging with her own band.

In 2010 she won the Crowded House International song writing competition and was invited to perform with the band at a concert in Sydney.

Neil Finn praised her work for its "unusual lyrics and interesting melody" and her "very strong distinctive voice".

The last 6 months have seen her perform with an array of artists including Chet Faker, Alex Lloyd and Sarah Blasko to large audiences including the famous Sydney Opera House Forecourt.

Sarah's 2015 EP 'Humans' deals with themes of human nature such as questioning, truth, realisation and loss. She is currently finishing an album to be released this year.

Sarah has a strong interest in her old school and follows Westlake music keenly through alumni music groups and a fortunate Westlake connection - her mother, Linley McCallum is a music teacher at Westlake Girls.

Lisa Wallbutton, Class of 2003 Tall Fern NZ National Basketball team

Lisa is a member of the Tall Ferns trial squad that gathering in Auckland in May as the team builds up for a June Olympic Qualifying Tournament in France.

Lisa was a talented basketballer during her years at Westlake, playing in age group national representative teams from 2001. In 2002, in Year 12, she led the successful Westlake Open team that won regional competitions and finished 4^{th} in the National Championship. In addition she played in the top netball team and achieved at a high level in national secondary schools mountain bike championships.

She joined Harbour Breeze in 2004 and was named Outstanding Young Player for the Women's National Basketball League in 2004 and 2005.

She combined her playing with a degree in Sport and Recreation from AUT and while based in Auckland she helped coach Westlake basketball teams. In 2013 she was able to come to the Westlake Basketball training, talk with the girls and also see the new sports facilities.

She debuted for the Tall Ferns in 2005 and competed in the 2006 Commonwealth Games in Melbourne where the team won Silver, and the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Other career highlights are the FIBA Oceania Championships in 2009, 2011, and 2013.

Lisa has played in the national leagues on both sides of the Tasman. In Australia she played for teams in the South Eastern Australian League and completed a Master's Degree in Clinical Exercise Physiology (Rehabilitation) at Charles Sturt University before moving to Western Australia.

She is currently an Exercise Physiologist at Active Life Rehabilitation in Perth and plays for the Perth Red Blacks.

Lisa reflects on her Westlake days.

"I have really good memories of my time playing basketball at Westlake, Friday night was game night and easily the highlight of my week. Looking back I think the best thing about playing basketball at school was the friends I made and the people I met along the way.

I now live in Perth and a few weeks ago I caught up with three old team mates from school over here. We reminisced about our time playing together at Westlake and on and off court antics at tournament week and shared a few good laughs. I think the bonds you make with people through sport are really special and different to anything else I have experienced in life.

High school years are important years in terms of player development and I was lucky enough to be exposed to some really passionate coaches early on that definitely inspired me to stick with the sport. Looking back I could have been a better athlete in return.

I used to be late for everything and some days if my school bag was too full I would leave my basketball shoes at home and train in bare feet!

Overall I look back with very fond memories of my time playing basketball at Westlake"

Looking Back

20 years ago - A look back at 1996

1996 was the first year that Westlake held a Cultural Mosaic International Evening. An 'Asian Association' had been formed in 1994 and supported by ESOL staff and Deans, they organized Orientation Dinners and a range of cultural activities. In 1996, much of the enthusiasm and hard work for the international night came from a small core of 7th Formers - Lovinia Chapman, Yvonne Lin, Erana Le Heron, Christabell Siakisini and Elizabeth Ewing who 'hoped that such a performance would contribute to racial harmony at Westlake' (1996 yearbook).

Since then it has been an annual event, becoming part of a Cultural Week of events in 1998 and expanding each year as the school population has grown and become increasingly diverse. There is now a Chinese Night and a Korean Night, combined with Westlake Boys, as well as a week of international and cultural events and activities at Westlake Girls organized largely by the prefects.

It is fitting that, since 1998, an award has been made annually at the Westlake prize-giving to a student who is 'the most passionate in encouraging the Promotion of Cultural Harmony at Westlake'. This is the Elizabeth Ewing Cultural Mosaic Award and is named in the memory of Elizabeth Jane Ewing who was one of the instigators of the Mosaic and its aim. Sadly, she passed away in 1997 in her first year of university, having battled a serious illness through her 7th Form year.

Westlake Girls made a significant contribution to the Fiji Cyclone Winston Humanitarian effort in April. Spearheaded by service prefects and a staff member Pravina Ali, the WGHS initiative extended to Westlake Boys High School and the whole Westlake community.
